

GRADING SCALE

Class rank is reported each semester and is determined by calculating a student's course-weighed grade point average over an extended 4.0 scale. Valedictorian and Salutatorian are determined by calculating class rank after the completion of the final semester. It is possible to get over a 4.0 GPA once weighting of the student's final grade has occurred. Passing is considered 60 and above. Final exam/combined project and exam grade counts for 20% of all courses.

THE COMMUNITY, SCHOOL & STAFF

Easthampton High School is an accredited public high school with a committed and highly qualified faculty who provide a rigorous and relevant curriculum for all students. Easthampton's academic program includes courses designed to meet the needs of all students and to prepare every student for college or a career. High interest, personalized, and diverse course offerings include Early Childhood Education, Technologies, Multi-Media, Design Tech, World Languages, Calculus, Forensics, Fine and Performing Arts, and options for dual enrollment at area colleges. The faculty at Easthampton High School consists of 33 teachers, 2 school counselors, 1 school adjustment counselor, and 6 support staff. The current enrollment is 423 students.

Easthampton is a small New England city located in Hampshire County of Western Massachusetts. The current population is approximately 16,000. The greater Easthampton area is evolving as a destination for many new businesses, artisans, residents and consumers. Economic growth and development is clearly progressing in the area. Easthampton offers numerous opportunities for education, as it is situated near several area colleges, including The Five College Consortium, The Cooperating Colleges of Greater Springfield, and Greenfield Community College. The commitment of the community, parents, guardians, teachers and administrators to education is made obvious by the involvement of each in the activities of the school and the lives of the students.

SCHOOL MEMBERSHIPS & AFFILIATIONS

Easthampton High School is accredited by the Massachusetts State Department of Education and the New England Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools. The school participates in the Massachusetts Interscholastic Athletic Association and Pioneer Valley Interscholastic Athletic Conference. Easthampton High School is a member of the College Board, MA Secondary Schools Administrators Association, National Honor Society, National Association of Student Councils, American Vocational Association, National Association of College Admission Counselors, American School Counselor Association, Massachusetts School Counselors Association, and Hampden-Hampshire Secondary/Post-Secondary Career Vocational Technical Education Linkages. Additionally, it is affiliated with the Collaborative for Educational Services and the Lower Pioneer Valley Education Collaborative.

CORONAVIRUS DISEASE (COVID-19)

Since March 2020, our school, like all schools, has been severely disrupted by the COVID-19 pandemic. Here is how we responded to the rapid close of our school in the spring of the 2019-2020 school year, and how we have reopened school in the fall of the 2020-2021 school year.

SPRING OF 2019-2020

Our school officially closed on March 13, 2020. We could not guarantee that all students had remote access and held students "harmless" if they could not participate in remote learning. The impact on our grading for the spring semester was as follows:

- Third quarter grade was the numeric grade based on completed work
- Fourth quarter was graded Pass/Excused. If a student participated in remote learning and completed 60% of the assigned work, they earned a "P" for the quarter, and their final grade for the class was calculated by adding 5 points to the 3rd quarter grade.
- · If the student did not sufficiently participate in the 4th quarter, they earned an "Excused", and their final grade was the same grade they earned in the third quarter.
- · While spring sports were cancelled, most clubs continued to meet virtually.

FALL OF 2020-2021

On September 14, 2020 EHS opened school in a fully remote model. We have restored full expectations for attendance and grading for the fall semester classes. Curriculum adjustments are being made based on pre-testing and covering material that students may have lost due to the closure in the spring.

- · Clubs will begin meeting virtually in October.
- Soccer, Cross Country, Golf, and Volleyball will run on a modified schedule. Football and Cheer will practice during the fall with the intended start date of late Fall.


